I. Call to Order, Welcome and Introductions: Corpus Christi Fire Chief Robert Rocha called the meeting to order at 10:34 a.m. Chief Rocha thanked everyone for their participation and commitment to a safe, well-informed community.

II. Acceptance of Minutes: The March 1, 2022, minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Billy Delgado with second by Briana Perez, to approve the minutes as presented. Motion passed.

III. New Business/Old Business: Chief Rocha presented a proposed slate of officers, the LEPC Executive Committee, for 2022-2024. A motion to accept the proposal by Chief Rocha was made by Billy Delgado with second by Christopher Boyce. Motion passed.

IV. Upcoming Training in the Community/Conferences: Training opportunities for the community and first responders can be found at [www.coastalbendcan.org](http://www.coastalbendcan.org) and [www.preparingtexas.org](http://www.preparingtexas.org). Additional opportunities will be discussed by the subcommittees. It was noted that the Coastal Bend Hurricane Conference is being held this week at the Regional Fairgrounds. Classes for NIMS 300 and 400 will be held in July and are filling up.

V. Coordinator's Report: Chief Rocha and Joanne Salge continue work with the International Association of Fire Chiefs. Several members of the LEPC will travel to Baltimore in June for the International Hazmat Conference June 9-12. Thanks to everyone who assisted in the Safe Digging Workshop on April 29 at the Del Mar West FEMA Dome. Upcoming meetings will be held in person, except for the LEPC Finance Committee.

VI. Subcommittee Reports:

1. Finance Subcommittee: Rosie Rodriguez provided the financial report for 2021-2022 fiscal year. As of May 1, 42.18% of the budget has been expended. The 2021 Reverse Alert payment was due in December and was fully funded. The motion to accept the financial report as presented was made by Philip Woods and second by William Thompson. Motion passed. Joanne reported that the Tier II donations for 2021-2022 are \$109,015, to date. The LEPC Finance Committee has requested Chief Rocha and Chief Quintero to work with the City's Finance Department to allow the LEPC to receive payments by credit card. Chief Rocha will continue to monitor status of this request. The next meeting will be held on June 30, 2022, at 3:00pm on WebEx.
2. Risk Awareness Subcommittee: Sharon Murphy reported 26,890 people have signed up for Reverse Alert. Work is underway to revitalize the notification system and get more citizens signed up to receive notices. The LEPC has delivered shelter in place kits to area schools. Over


several years, CCISD has received approximately 2,535 kits. Additional supplies have been ordered. The LEPC participated in the Mireles Elementary Science Extravaganza and met with 300 students. The next meeting is June 23, 2022, at 11:30 a.m., CCFD Training Room, 2406 Leopard Street.

3. Pipeline Damage Prevention Subcommittee: Randy Brock reported the committee hosted an in-person group session (tailgate style) to promote safety/education on March 16 and has another planned for May 10. A Safe Digging Workshop is held on April 29 with 156 attendees. Utility inserts (98,500) were in city and county utility bills in April 2022. April was also recognized as Safe Digging Month with proclamations by Nueces County Commissioners and Corpus Christi City Council. The next meeting will be held on July 5, 2022, at 9:30am in the City's EOC, 2406 Leopard Street.
4. Emergency Response and Communications Subcommittee: Tony Perez provided a summary of recent and upcoming events/ training opportunities. Union Pacific Railcar training took place March 1-3 and a full- scale drill on March 4 at ON Stevens Water Treatment Plant. Approximately 200 attended the training. Coastal Bend Hurricane Conference is scheduled for May 4-5, 2022. ICS -300 and ICS-400 classes are scheduled for July in the City's Emergency Operations. The 80-hour Hazmat Technician Specialist Class will be held on May 16-27, 2022. Cheniere will hold a drill on June 15 and Plains All American/Eagle Ford Terminal will drill on June 22-23, 2022. Lyondell will host first responders in College Station on May 14-5 and October 15-16. CITGO will host a three- day drill in October at the RMB Regional Fairgrounds. The next meeting will be held on July 27, 2022.
