- I. Call to Order, Welcome and Introductions: Chief Robert Rocha, called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m.
- II. Acceptance of Minutes: The November 1, 2022, minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Billy Delgado and second by Kathy Ard Blattner to approve the minutes as presented. Motion passed.
- III. New Business/Old Business: None.
- IV. Upcoming Training in the Community/Conferences: Billy Delgado announced upcoming classes ICS 300 scheduled for February 8, 9 & 10, 2023 and ICS 400 is scheduled for February 22 & 23, 2023. Hazmat Training see Nueces County Facebook for more info it will be held at the Annville Fire Department. Training opportunities for the community and first responders can be found at www.coastalbendcan.org and www.preparingtexas.org. Additional opportunities will be discussed by the subcommittees.
- V. Coordinator's Report: Joanne Salge, announced the LEPC Committee Goals for 2023 are included in their package for review. Also included are the 2023 Local Emergency Planning Committee Meeting dates. Joanne informed LEPC has attended several community meetings also the Coastal Plains meetings, Corpus Christi Advisory Community Council meetings. Joanne informed Tier II reports are due March 1, 2023, to TCEQ.
- VI. Subcommittee Reports:
 1. Finance Subcommittee: Rosie Rodriguez, provided the financial report for FY 2022-2023. As of December 31, 2022, 21.38 % of the budget was expended. The 2022 Reverse Alert payment of \$78,400 for Everbridge year 4 of 5 was paid. A motion was made by Alfonso Trevino, Jr., second by Louie Ray to approve the report. Motion passed. Tier II donations are at \$98,000 towards our budget goal of \$135,949.47. The next meeting will be held on March 6, 2023.
 2. Risk Awareness Subcommittee: Sharon Murphy reported 27,386 people have signed up for Reverse Alert. Sharon stated the goal is to increase to 30,000. The LEPC has delivered 1,100 Shelter in Place kits to area schools and communities in 2022. The committee is discussing ways


to improve communications and outreach. The LEPC has applied for a TCEQ grant requesting: A Community-wide Survey, Fire Department Hazmat equipment and Shelter in Place kits totaling \$67,238.23. Sharon informed that Magellan has donated \$3,000 for Shelter in Place kits. Sharon informed that the Safety video is available to contractors, it is also on the LEPC website. The next meeting will be held on February 23, 2023, at 11:30 a.m., 3rd Floor Training Room, 2406 Leopard, Corpus Christi, Texas, 78408.

3. Pipeline Damage Prevention Subcommittee: Randy Brock, informed the Committee had 4 tailgate meetings in 2022. The committee will continue the tailgate meetings monthly. Randy informed a Safe Digging Workshop is scheduled for April 20, 2023, at the FEMA Dome. We are hoping to reach out to landscapers, fencing companies, pool companies, trenching companies and rental equipment companies. April is Safe Digging Month with City/County Proclamations. The next meeting will be held on March 7, 2023, at 9:30 a.m. on the 4th Floor EOC, 2406 Leopard, Corpus Christi, Texas 78408
4. Emergency Response and Communications Subcommittee: John Perez, Jr., informed the LEPC and CCFD attended Hot Zone Conference in October. Magellan Midstream and La Quinta Terminal conducted drills. Enterprise Products had a Tank Truck Training. Targa Pipeline conducted training and a tabletop drill at CCFD Station #1. Site visits being planned for Cheniere and Ergon Asphalt and Emulsions. Union Pacific will provide a railcar training again this year at ON Stevens Water Treatment Plant. Training will begin on Tuesday, February 28, March 1, March 2 followed by a full-scale drill on March 3rd. The training is free and open to anyone interested. TEEKS credit is available. The LEPC will apply for the TDEM HMEP Commodity Flow Study to be conducted in 2024. The next meeting will be held on January 25, 2023, 3rd Floor Training Room, 2406 Leopard, Corpus Christi, Texas 78408.

VII. Presentation: Joseph Cantu, LEPC Vice-Chairman, presented Chief Robert Rocha with a special gift and thanked him for the years of service as Chairman for the LEPC from 2011 to 2023. He stated it was an honor to work with Chief Rocha and with his support we were able to build partnerships, purchase equipment and that was a great accomplishment.

VIII. Public Comment/Announcements: Andy Saenz, Flint Hills Public Information Office gave a brief report on the oil spill incident near Ingleside. Mr. Saenz stated that they continue to work together with other agencies, and will remain committed until resolved.
